# INFORMED CONSENT FORM — STUDENT

#### RESEARCH PROCEDURES

The digital files will be destroyed in 5 years.

There are no benefits to you as a participant other than to further research on teaching and learning in higher education.

## **CONFIDENTIALITY**

The data in this study will be confidential. A pseudonym will be placed on the digital interview file and the transcript file as well as on any other collected data. Through the use of an identification key, only the researchers will be able to link your interview data and course work to your identity.
